

This feedback will contribute to the drafting of the Strategy which will be shared with the Autism Strategy Advisory Committee and the autistic and autism communities for feedback, so that together we can create a fairer and more equitable future for all.





Health Undate

As part of the Malinauskas Government's massive investment into improving the capacity of the state's public health system, our local Lyell McEwin Hospital is receiving a major facelift.

Construction on the \$47 million project starts this March, delivering 48 beds, all in single rooms with ensuites. Not only will this improve patient comfort, but it also creates the opportunity for specialty care features for those needing a higher level of support. These works are

part of at least 550 more beds the Malinauskas Government are committed to deliver across the state.

The State Government has also committed a further \$4.5 million for a final phase to the Emergency Department expansion. This will increase the capacity from the originally planned 72 to 76 spaces and is due to be finished by the end of the year.

development of a temporary nine chair dialysis unit is finished and open, supporting the existing dialysis unit and increasing capacity to 21 chairs.

The Malinauskas Government is also delivering its commitment for 24 more mental health beds at Modbury Hospital, with a first look at the unit's design revealed in February.

The \$44 million mental health In addition, the \$1.2 million rehabilitation unit, will be combined

with a 20-bed older persons mental health unit in a single build representing a total of 44 purposebuilt new mental health beds at the hospital.

These additional mental health beds form part of the Malinauskas Government's historic \$124 million commitment to build and open 72 new mental health rehabilitation beds through the establishment of 24-bed units at Modbury, The Queen Elizabeth Hospital and Noarlunga Hospital.

Work has also commenced on the Government's commitment to a Modbury Hospital Cancer Centre, introducing cancer services to the hospital for the first time, with concept designs underway.













Safe Haven for community mental health support now open

Located in Salisbury, Safe Haven provides peer-led support to the community in a specially designed nonclinical setting. The first of its kind, Safe Haven is funded by NALHN and will help ease pressure on our emergency departments.
